OKIMONO MEANS 'CARVING TO STAND IN AN ALCOVE' AND THESE MINIATURE SCULPTURES WERE MADE IN JAPAN IN THE 19TH CENTURY ALMOST EXCLUSIVELY IN IVORY. THEY WERE OFTEN CARVED ON COMMISSION FOR WESTERN PATRONS WHO REQUIRED A LARGER RENDERING OF A FAVOURITE NETSUKE. THEIR FINE DETAIL AND HIGHLY SKILLED NATURALISTIC CARVING SUGGESTS THAT THEY WERE UNDOUBTEDLY INTENDED AS ORIGINAL WORKS OF ART TO BE CONTEMPLATED AND ENJOYED AT LEISURE.
