WITH MATCHLOCK GUNS, WHEEL LOCKS AND FLINTLOCKS IT WAS NECESSARY TO USE FINER POWDER IN THE PAN THAN IN THE CHARGE. THE ACT OF FILLING THE PAN WAS CALLED PRIMING, AND THE FLASK TO HOLD THE FINE POWDER, THE PRIMER. IN EUROPE, IT COULD BE COMBINED WITH THE SPANNER FOR WHEEL LOCKS OR WITH A BULLET POUCH. FLASKS OF ALL KINDS WERE FAVOURITE OBJECTS FOR DECORATION, BUT THE PRIMER BEING SMALL AND CONSTANTLY CARRIED WAS PARTICULARLY CHOSEN FOR THIS PURPOSE.
