A FAVOURITE DESIGN IS TO CARVE THE BONE INTO THE SIMILITUDE OF ROPE, WITH 'WORMING' OF SMALLER LINE ALONG ITS LAYS. A HANDLE IS CARVED OUT OF THE WHALE'S TOOTH AND INSETS OF BALEEN, SILVER, COCOA TREE OR EBONY, GIVE VARIETY AND FINISH'.
