THE KUBA ONCE PRODUCED A VARIETY OF DISTINCTIVE VESSELS FOR DRINKING PALMWINE. THIS VESSEL IS CARVED IN A TYPICAL CEPHALOMORPHIC STYLISED FORM WITH A LARGE FEMALE HEAD SUPPORTED ON ABBREVIATED LEGS THAT TERMINATE IN ABSTRACT FEET. THE STYLISTIC FEATURES OF THE FACE; THE HAIRLINE RIDGE, CRESCENT SHAPED EYEBROWS, SCARIFICATION ROUNDELS BY THE EARS AND TRIANGULAR MOUTH ARE ALL SIMILAR TO THOSE FOUND ON KUBA MASKS.

PALMWINE IS A NATURALLY ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGE THAT EXUDES FROM THE CORE OF THE RAFFIA PALMTREE WHEN IT IS TAPPED. THE LIQUID IS COLLECTED IN THE EARLY MORNING AND LATE AFTERNOON. TODAY, PALMWINE VENDORS OFFER THIS BEVERAGE IN A PLASTIC CUP, BUT IN THE 19TH AND EARLY 20TH CENTURY KUBA MEN WOULD PURCHASE A DECORATED WOODEN PALMWINE CONTAINER FOR THEIR PERSONAL USE.
