THE LARGER SEA MAMMALS POSE A DIRECT PHYSICAL THREAT TO THE INUIT HUNTER IN THE ARCTIC. WALRUS CAN BE QUITE DANGEROUS AS A BIG BULL CAN WEIGH MORE THAN AN ENTIRE CREW OF EIGHT MEN PLUS THEIR UMIK BOAT AND EQUIPMENT. AN ANNOYED WALRUS DOES NOT SHRINK FROM ATTACKING A LARGE BOAT, NOT TO MENTION A LONE MAN STANDING BESIDE A CRACK IN THE ICE. AS WALRUS FREQUENTLY CONGREGATE AND OFTEN TRAVEL IN PODS OF DOZENS OR EVEN HUNDREDS, WALRUS HUNTING HAD TO BE CONDUCTED WITH CONSIDERABLE CAUTION. SERVING AS A MAGICAL AID FOR BOTH PROTECTION AND HUNTING SUCCESS, THESE TALISMANIC CARVINGS HELPED THE HUNTER IN HIS ARDUOUS TASK.
