THE WHALE-MEN'S PRIDE OF OCCUPATION AND CELEBRATION OF THEIR SEAFARING PROWESS IS REFLECTED IN THE MANY ITEMS OF SCRIMSHAW THEY MADE ONBOARD SHIP. THIS ACCURATE IMAGE OF A HARPOON IS DRAWN FROM THE WHALE-MEN'S OWN EXPERIENCE RATHER THAN BEING COPED FROM PUBLISHED ILLUSTRATIONS. OFTEN AWAY AT SEA FOR TWO TO THREE YEARS, SCRIMSHAW WAS A MEANS OF ALLAYING BOREDOM, FRUSTRATION AND AGGRESSION WITHIN THE CONFINES OF A SMALL SHIP. USING THE UNWANTED BY PRODUCTS OF THE CATCH, THE CAPTAIN WAS TOLERANT OF THE LONG HOURS SPENT 'SCRIMSHANTING'.
