LITERATURE

CIPPI SUCH AS THIS EXAMPLE WERE CREATED TO PROTECT AN INDIVIDUAL OR AREAS FROM THE PERILS OF WILD ANIMALS. THE GOD HORUS IS SHOWN SUBDUING THESE ANIMALS BY TRAMPLING OR HOLDING THEM. THE ICONOGRAPHY CAN ALSO BE FOUND ON DESIGNS OF MESOPOTAMIAN SEALS AND SCULPTURE. AS THE DESIGN NEARLY ALWAYS INCORPORATES THE GOD STANDING UPON TWO COUNTER-FACING CROCODILES, THESE SCULPTURES ARE ALSO KNOWN AS 'HORUS ON THE CROCODILES' STELAE.
