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LITERATURE

RALPH TURNBULL, A SCOTTISH IMMIGRANT TO THE ISLANDS, WAS PROBABLY THE BEST KNOWN MAKERS AMONG SEVERAL OTHER CABINET MAKERS OF REPUTE IN JAMAICA DURING THE EARLY TO MID 19TH CENTURY. HE ARRIVED ON

THE ISLAND WITH HIS TWO BROTHERS IN AROUND 1815. MOSTLY FAMED FOR THEIR EXCLUSIVE USE OF EXOTIC LOCAL TIMBERS INCLUDING: BITTERWOOD, LOGWOOD, WILD OLIVE, CANDLEWOOD, COFFEE AND PRICKLY YELLOW.

THE SPECIMEN WOODS IN OUR BOX INCLUDE: YACCA, JUNIPER CEDAR, WILD FIG, BLACK EBONY, WILD CABBAGE AND HIDDLEWOOD AND COCONUT.
